

Local Law Changing Grievance Day for Hartsville, NY

Town of Hartsville (Steuben County)

Local Law #2 of the year 2016

A local law: Providing for a change in Grievance Day

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Hartsville, Steuben County, as follows:

Article 1: Title:

The title of this law shall be "To Change Grievance Day".

Article 2: Legislative Intent:

This law is enacted to authorize an assessing unit that employs an assessor, who also services elsewhere in the capacity, to change its Grievance Day, pursuant to Section 512 1-a of the Real Property Tax Law.

Article 3: Grievance Day:

Grievance Day is to be held on the first Tuesday after the fourth Tuesday in May. This change will begin the year of 2016.

Article 4: Effective Date:

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.
