

Local Law #2 of 2018

Section 1. Title:

Local Law #2 of 2018 to change Grievance Day for the Town of Hartsville.

Section 2. Authority:

This Local Law #2 of 2018 is adopted pursuant to Section 512 1-a of the Real Property Tax Law to authorize the Town of Hartsville to change its Grievance Day.

Section 3. Supersession:

This local law shall supersede Local Law #2 of 2016 in establishing the date of Grievance Day in the Town of Hartsville.

Section 4. Legislative Intent:

Local Law #2 of 2018 is hereby enacted to authorize an assessing unit that employs an assessor who also services elsewhere in the capacity to change Grievance Day in the Town of Hartsville to be **the 2nd Wednesday AFTER the 4th Tuesday in May**. It is therefore noted that Grievance Day in the Town of Hartsville may fall within the month of June.

Section 5. Inconsistency:

All other local laws and ordinances of the Town of Hartsville that are inconsistent with the provision of this local law are hereby repealed, provided however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this local law shall be in addition to such other local laws or ordinances regulating and governing such subject matter covered by this local law.

Section 6. Savings Clause:

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 7. Effective Date:

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.
